

Questions Asked by Webinar Attendees – 04/28/09

Q: If we have a homeschooling student who is in an ISP, does College Plus take the place of the ISP, or do they still need to be in one since they are still in high school?

A: Many CollegePlus! students in California remain in an ISP so it may be required by California state law. However, remaining in an ISP is not necessary to success in CollegePlus! since students in the program cover everything they need to graduate from high school and more.
