

Q: My son was getting ready to start taking some CLEP tests - just to save some money when he entered college in 2 years. He's now looking at getting his BA from CollegePlus! Should he wait to begin his CLEP tests or go ahead?

A: As long as he does the more general exams (history, math, science), he can start at any time!

Q: You've mentioned Apologia science texts, how do Bob Jones science text compare for preparation?

A: BJU textbooks are also comprehensive. However, Apologia is a bit more interesting and on a student's level, especially if they are not naturally science oriented.

Q: My son was getting ready to start taking some CLEP test - just to save some money when he entered college in 2 years. He's now looking at getting his BA from CollegePlus!. Should he wait to begin his CLEP tests or go ahead?

A: As long as he does the more general exams (history, math, science), he can start at any time!

Q: Is Video Text Algebra modules A - F rigorous enough to pass the math CLEP?

A: Yes, Video Text is a great resource of preparing for the math CLEP exams. I'm not sure if A-F is enough for the CLEP but what you can do is compare the percentage breakdown of the exam and compare it to the skills learned in those modules. You can see that percentage breakdown here:

Q: AP verses CLEP--what's the difference? Why do a lot of colleges want AP over CLEP?

A: AP is more common for high schoolers to take and there are some AP exams that don't have a parallel CLEP. However, colleges accept both of them for credit.

Q: Are textbooks included in the price quoted in the College Prep program?

A: The textbooks are included in the \$945 price, but not in the \$695 price.

Q: Are these webinars posted for viewing later, and if so, where?

Q: What is your opinion of speedyprep.com?

A: We don't have too much experience with speedyprep.com at this point. Most of our students use www.instantcert.com

Q: I've heard that Saxon is "lacking" at the high school level, is that true?

A: Our students have experienced the exact opposite when taking the CLEP exams. Saxon has been great preparation for CLEPs and college courses.

Q: Can you please provide a copy of the PowerPoint notes to attendees of this seminar?

A: Yes, we will be emailing this to all attendees later this week.

Q: Do you have a list of recommended books/curriculum for each of the core subjects?

A: If you enroll a student in CollegePlus! Prep, your Collegiate Advisor will provide you with a customized list of recommended subjects and curriculum.

Q: Is there a place on your website where we can look at the degree our student may be interested in and see what the optimal subjects are?

A: You can see a complete list of majors offered at www.collegeplus.org/majors. We'll be discussing optimal subjects in a few moments in the webinar.

Q: do you take SATs to enter CollegePlus!?

A: No, there is no requirement for students to take an SAT test in order to enroll in the CollegePlus! Core program.

Q: Does a CollegePlus! Prep group all work on the same CLEPs?

A: Yes, they do.

Q: What age is the prep program geared for?

A: The Prep program is geared for students who are at least starting their freshman year in high school; specifically for those who are 13-15 years of age.

Q: College mathematics covers a bit of algebra and geometry but also has other topic not generally covered in a typical HS text - what do you suggest for prep for someone interested in a BA and possibly not able to CLEP the Algebra.

A: The ALEKS courses may be the best option for a student who isn't bent toward math. You can see more about ALEKS at <http://www.aleks.com/>

Q: Is the prep program an option if a few CLEP credits have already been earned but not English Comp? How would that work?

A: The two CLEPs covered in Prep are the Analyzing and Interpreting Literature and English Comp w/ Essay. If the student already has CLEP credit that doesn't conflict with those tests, than CollegePlus! Prep is still a great option.

Q: What would be a good choice for HS studies for English and American Lit with the goal of CLEPing at the end of the year.

A: For consolidated groupings of good American Literature, check out BJU American Literature and with free content from www.sparknotes.com. English composition can be covered with ABeka and BJU textbooks.

Q: Does CollegePlus! offer any kind of scholarship for the full program (books and advisory) and if so how may we apply for it. We have researched and been looking at your program for sometime but are unable to afford it.

A: Unfortunately we do not offer a scholarship program at this point in time. The good news is that we start this program 3 times a year at the beginning of each semester: Sep. 1, Jan. 1, and June 1.

Q: Does this work for engineering or other technical degrees?

A: These types of degrees don't typically lend themselves to distance learning. However, the critical thinking skills taught in CollegePlus! Prep and the resources our students use are great preparation for succeeding in any college program.

Q: If we sign up for just the Advisory role, I assume we would purchase the texts needed. Assuming you would tell us what to purchase.

A: That is correct. It is more cost effective, however, to purchase the complete package, as we are able to offer the materials at a highly discounted price.

Q: how about Rosetta Stone Spanish, what level would they need to be through to be ready to take the test

A: Rosetta Stone doesn't cover grammar extensively either as far as we're aware. I would compare this with the percentage breakdown at this page on the College Board's website:

Q: How does David Quine's Worldview curriculum do with any of these subjects we are talking about?

A: David Quine's Cornerstone Curriculum is excellent for these subjects. You'll just have to supplement the curriculum with some CLEP specific study guides.

Q: Is there any way for College Prep students to connect with other students in their area?

A: Definitely. We'd be happy to provide local students with your contact info if there are some in your area.

Q: How many credits does a civil engineering degree in FL require? How many can CP! help me get?

A: Chad, civil engineering isn't a degree that lends itself to distance learning. However, we could help you CLEP out of the maximum amount of credits your desired program will allow. To find out more info on this, check out www.collegeplus.org/collegeofyourchoice

Q: When I enroll in CP!, will the advisor help me with the COYC program, or do I need to enroll in the specific COYC program to gain the information?

A: yes, the advisor is there to help you with your COYC program and will already be aware of which major you're studying for.

Q: How well does the Math U See curriculum prepare students for college? Thanks!

A: Yes, Math U See curriculum is a good resource for college preparation.

Q: I have already purchased Understanding the Times Christian World View - Can this be used as a CLEP Prep or would it be more beneficial to get credit from Bryan College for this? They offer credits for this class.

A: Understanding The Times appears to be a very comprehensive, intense worldview curriculum. We do not utilize this specific course in CollegePlus! Prep, though it could be a very good worldview training course.

Q: I have Traditional Logic I by Martin Cothran, Classical Trivium Core Series. Is this too elementary for an 11th grade student who hasn't had logic before? Recommendations???

A: I am not very familiar with that specific book, so I am unable to sufficiently answer that. Sorry!

Q: Do you recommend Understanding the Times for a complete worldview course?

A: We do not specifically use the Understanding the times program, though it appears to be a very comprehensive and intensive worldview training program.

Q: Is Math-U-See Geometry also recommended?

A: Geometry is not a major math subject tested in the CLEP math exams so a comprehensive text like Math U See may not be necessary.

Q: I just ordered the Advisory & Thinking Skills Bundle on Mon. the 27th . Am I able to get the extra \$50 off? I paid \$799.

Q: I would like some suggestions for Test preparation for a career in Ministry, we are planning on taking as many CLEPS as possible for the complimentary subjects. We are planning on a degree from Thomas Edison, and will be using Life experiences such as teaching a Bible Study, etc. Thank you so much!

A: Parker, we typically reserve specific exam recommendations for students enrolled in CollegePlus! If you'd like to complete a degree and max out CLEP exams, you can apply to our program at www.collegeplus.org/apply

Q: If a student desires to apply for a masters program after acquiring their bachelor's degree will they be able to receive a GPA from Thomas Edison?

A: Yes, they will get a GPA for all courses taken.

Q: If a student does not complete a degree through CollegePlus!, do the college hours on the transcript decrease the availability of scholarships because they are not a new college student?

A: Scholarships would only be in jeopardy if the CLEPs are declared. However, if you opt to not have a CLEP transcript sent to the college, the full scholarship can be taken advantage of.

Q: how many students are in a learning pod?

A: There are 4-7 students in each CollegePlus! learning pod.

Q: How rigid is the schedule for the prep course? If a student is out of town, how much flexibility is there to catch up with the group?

A: For the sake of other students in the students learning pod, we appreciate students to stay on course as much as possible. If students need to go out of town, etc, they will need to study harder before and/or after to stay on track.

Q: Does this program prepare a student to successfully complete an AP (Advanced Placement) exam?

A: The CollegePlus! program does not typically utilize AP exams.

Q: If I have many of these books can they be deducted from the price of the CollegePlus! Prep tuition?

A: There are pricing options geared towards students that already own most of the required materials, such as our Advisory Only option, which is only \$695 until July 31st.

Q: If we use the Core or Prep programs, do we need to do this sort of comparing that Jessica is talking about or does the coaching provide us the help to do this?

A: CP Prep coaching provides an advisement session that will walk through all textbook recommendations based on what you already own or what you can purchase if you don't have any already.

Q: If we want to enroll in Prep for 2010-2011 year how soon can we register for it?

A: If you're on our mailing list, you'll see when the prep registration opens again next summer. We'd love to have your student in the program then!

Q: My daughter will be in 9th grade this fall. I wanted to have her do the Prep this fall but my wife does not want to have her do that. Is there really any loss in waiting a year.

A: CollegePlus! Prep will still be very beneficial for your daughter next year.

Q: I'm interested in medical forensics. What CollegePlus degree would be best for me to sign up for?

A: Thanks for your question, Tabitha. I'm not personally familiar with that degree. It would be best for you to fill out our no cost/no obligation application to speak with a program advisor about that particular major and to see if it can be earned through distance learning. Q: I'm sorry.... I was referring to School of Tomorrow's Accelerated Christian Education(?) ACE curriculum. Are their high school courses rigorous enough to prepare for exams?

A: Sorry for the miscue! I'm not familiar with ACE however, you can compare ACE with the question topic breakdown at this link: <http://www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/clep/exams.html>

Q: Is ACE rigorous enough?

A: The ACE has formulated the CLEP exams to reflect how well a student compares to those who have completed a college course in that subject.

Q: Are you aware if anyone has ever used Teaching Company courses to study for exams?

A: I'm not familiar with that particular curriculum. Is there a curriculum that is similar to the Teach Company texts?

Q: The Teaching Company has courses on audio and video with study guides. Some are high school level, but almost all are college level courses. www.teach12.com Expensive, but fascinating. Our local library owns dozens of them.

A: Very interesting. I would compare them to the percentage breakdown of the CLEP exams to see if all required information is covered. You can see an exam description at this page:

Q: Is an SAT required for the online colleges that you recommend?

A: No, the SAT is not required!

Q: Do you recommend any other accelerated learning options besides CLEP for Thomas Edison?

A: In addition to CLEP, there are DSST exams. www.getcollegecredit.com

Q: Is it called Excellent in Writing one of the curriculum??

A: You're probably referring to Andrew Pudewa's Institute for Excellence in Writing.

Q: is Rosetta stone or tell me more language programs sufficient to be able to CLEP out of?

A: I wouldn't suggest them. The language exams are very complicated and probably require tutoring and a college level textbook to pass.

Q: my son wants to get a degree in computer graphics/web design and also business.. is this something that CollegePlus! offers

A: We do not offer degrees in computer graphics or web design, but we do offer a degree in business. Often within this field of graphics/web design, the most powerful lever is that of the student's developed portfolio. If you would like to leverage distance learning, one way to do it would be to have your student mentor under an established professional whilst working through his business degree. This way he gets both the credential simultaneous to the business and work experience.

Q: Is Teaching Textbooks Algebra1 & 2 a curriculum that would be considered rigorous enough to pass the Math CLEP?

A: Yes, Teaching Textbooks is recommending for passing the math CLEP exams. This curriculum has been recommended by one of our CP Prep moms.

Q: What do you suggest for literature or composition? We are definitely lacking in composition.

A: We highly suggest the Advanced Communication Series by Andrew Pudewa....it is fun, engaging, and effective.

Q: What about James Stobaugh's Literature and History curricula for passing CLEP?

A: I've heard of James but I'm not familiar with his curriculum. You can compare what he teaches with what will be encountered on the exam at this link:

Q: Is TELL ME MORE Spanish (1st 5 levels) an adequate curriculum for CLEP?

A: I'm not familiar with Tell Me More but you can compare the material covered in that with the exam topics at this link: http://www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/clep/ex_cls.html

Q: Is there a way to get credit for High school level Speech & Debate?

A: The easiest way to do that would be to take the public speaking DSST exam.

Q: What is the public speaking DSST exam?

A: Check out this fact sheet for more information about the Public Speaking DSST.

Q: Is there an engineering degree offered through Thomas Edison State College?

A: Yes there are options for engineering through distance learning. Give us a call for more details

Q: Is there any type of testing required for this program?

A: The CollegePlus! program utilizes several methods of testing, including CLEPs, DSSTs, and TECEPs.

Q: Last week someone said the Prep program isn't available until 2010. Is this true?

A: This is not correct. CollegePlus! Prep starts August 31st, and enrollments are happening now.

Q: I had already purchased the Deadliest Monster for our worldview next year. Would I need to switch to your recommendation in order to use the Prep program?

A: Prep utilizes the thinking Like A Christian resource for Worldview studies. However, you could still use the other worldview curriculum for worldview studies on your own. Extra worldview training can't hurt.

Q: Do I understand that at the end of the Prep program, the student takes the English Comp CLEP? If so, why then is the recommended schedule for College Core to do an hour each of math, english, and science before doing a focused study?

A: Good question! Since we'll be overseeing their study in CP Prep, we feel confident that they can CLEP pretty quickly. However, when they are starting CP Core on their own, we realize that English Comp may not be the student's strong point and they need to take more time to adequately prepare for the exam.

Q: If I tell the advisor the books we own in a particular subject--or had planned to use--will the advisor be able to evaluate those and tell me what I need to add, or if I need to make a change?

A: Absolutely! That's a major benefit to CP Prep!

Q: If we cannot join Prep, but would like to join Core next year, what CLEP should we work towards during the 10th grade year?

A: You can have your student take any exams that parallel subjects they've taken. However, a little bit of coaching goes a long way to passing these exams. Just be sure your students is adequately prepared based on the percentage breakdown when they take the exam. Q: My daughter took ABeka Biology last year (Freshman yr) and did very well. We had planned for her to take Apologia Chemistry this yr., but a friend suggested it would be better for her to take Adv. Biology (Apologia) instead, and then take the College Biology CLEP at the end of her Sophomore year. Which would be better for her to take--Chemistry or Adv. Biology? I thought I heard Jessica say Chem. Please clarify for me. Thanks.

A: Either route would be fine. She probably doesn't need advanced biology for the exam but taking it first wouldn't hurt.

Q: My son is 15 (soon to be 16) but I feel that he could really use the skills taught in the Prep course. Will he still be able to do CollegePlus! even if he is older? If he graduates before getting all his credits, can he still continue with the program?

A: We do allow students into CollegePlus! Prep even if they are older than 16, as long as they understand that they will be working with younger students through material that is primarily designed for younger students. And yes, if he graduates high school before completing his college credits, he can still continue in the CollegePlus! program.

Q: Jessica did not mention Math-U-See. Have you found it to be lacking in teaching the necessary understanding of the higher math courses?

A: I believe she mentioned after you wrote your question. It comes recommended by the moms we've talked to.

Q: my son is a senior in HS, already has taken 12 hrs of College by taking duel credit. Is CollegePlus! prep what we need or another program?

A: In a case like this we would recommend going with our core CollegePlus! program. Our coaching staff could help your son move quickly through his undergraduate degree upon completion of high school or

even in conjunction with his senior year in high school. With the forward progress he has already attained on his own, why stop? We'd encourage you to look at our core program as a means to catapult him further.

Q: My son is turning 13 in Aug but is in 8th grade Abekka. We want to do College Prep. However, knowing it is for 9th grade we are planning on waiting till next year. Problem is he is set to due Algebra I this year since he is ahead in Math. Do I hold him back in Math?

A: By no means would we recommend holding him back in math, keep his forward progress moving! Have you filled out an application yet? Depending on where he is at with Reading Comprehension and Grammar & Composition, he may still be able to start this year. I'd encourage you to fill out an app and speak with one of our academic or program advisors directly.

Q: My son wants to get his masters at Patrick Henry. Do they accept a BA from Benjamin Franklin College?

A: You'd have to check with Patrick Henry on their prerequisites. Sorry!

Q: My older daughter found that the flashcards on www.instacert.com was very helpful to help her prepare for CLEP exams.

A: InstantCert Academy has been used by many of our students, including myself, to prepare for CLEP exams.

Q: Some of the science courses that you mentioned are typically studied in ninth and tenth grade. Would you recommend taking a CLEP test immediately after studying the subject (such as Biology in 10th grade) even if I am not enrolled in CollegePlus! yet?

A: Yes, that would definitely be a good plan of action, as long as you supplement the exam prep with some study guides for those CLEP exams.

Q: Do you recommend books for prep skills?

A: We have incorporated several recommended prep materials into our CollegePlus! Prep program.

Q: If I don't join CollegePlus! prep, do you recommend books that would help me gain prep skills on my own?

A: We usually reserve these recommendations to students who enroll in one of our programs. Sorry!

Q: Do all colleges accept credits earned by CLEP tests?

A: There are about 3000 colleges and universities in the US that accept CLEP credit.

Q: Sorry, we've used BJ US History textbook and REA study guides for US History. Any other suggestions?

A: Lori, these exams are pretty complicated as you've found. I would suggest supplementing them with a typical college textbook like America: A Narrative History http://www.amazon.com/America-Narrative-History-Seventh-1/dp/0393927326/ref=sr_1_1?ie=UTF8&s=books&qid=1248833020&sr=8-1

Q: My children have successfully passed CLEP tests in Biology and College Math, but they are struggling to pass the sample tests in US History.

A: This is where we believe the Prep program could be of great help, especially when faced with exams that have more subjective type material / humanistic influence as do the the U.S. History Exams. Please consider submitting an application and we'll be glad to determine whether or not CollegePlus! Prep would be a great fit for you.

Q: What about Math U See?

A: Math U See covers all the necessary information. Just compare the knowledge your student has with the CLEP test percentage breakdown at this page:

Q: Would the Math-U-See curriculum adequately prepare a student for the Pre-Calculus CLEP exam?

A: I don't believe we have experience with Math U See on that level. It is adequate for the lower levels though. You can compare that material with the percentage breakdown for the exam at this link:

Q: Would The Learnables foreign language programs be adequate preparation for CLEP foreign language exams?

A: The Learnables are great for listening skills but lack the grammar needed to pass the exams. A typical college text or one from ACE would work well.

Q: What about Rosetta Stone for foreign language exams?

A: Rosetta Stone is good for listening skills but isn't very heavy on grammar. So, it isn't quite comprehensive for taking the CLEP Spanish exam.

Q: What are passing scores on CLEP tests? Do different schools have different standards?

A: CLEPs are graded on a scaled score range of 20-80, with a 50 being the ACE recommended credit granting score. You are correct, though, that different colleges have different policies regarding CLEP exams.

Q: What are your thoughts on Math U See for Algebra?

A: Math U See comes highly recommended from homeschool moms.

Q: What do you think of the VideoText Interactive Algebra and Geometry programs for preparation for the math exams?

A: Our students have used Video Text and done well on the CLEP exams!

Q: What is the average time for the group discussion and the advisor calls.

A: Those calls should be about an hour or less.

Q: is there any special equipment required?

A: Just a computer and a high speed internet connection.

Q: What is the best age for CollegePlus! Prep vs. CollegePlus!?

A: CollegePlus! Prep: 13-15 year olds, at least having completed 8th grade. CollegePlus! Core: at least a junior level in high school with some exceptions for sophomore knowledge levels combined with high levels of critical thinking. Please fill out a no-cost, no-obligation application and our program advisors will be able to work directly with your student to find the best fit!

Q: What supplement study guides for Biology do you suggest?

A: The REA CLEP guide for Biology is probably the best.

Q: What supplemental guides for Biology do you recommend?

A: We recommend the REA CLEP study Guide: http://www.amazon.com/CLEP-Biology-REA-CD-ROM-TESTware/dp/0738600490/ref=sr_1_1?ie=UTF8&qid=1248834507&sr=8-1. Please remember that this should only be used on the back of a proper high school academic approach to at least biology if not biology and chemistry.

Q: What was that number again?

A: 866.989.5432 or 830.885.5432

Q: Does CP! help with a student aspiring to get into the medical field?

A: We do offer degrees that focus in various areas, but also cover the prerequisites for medical school. And since TESC is a regionally accredited college, students should have no issues going into medical school.

Q: If my student is interested in the medical field, how would CP! fit in?

A: We have several premed options. You can see those here: www.collegeplus.org/majors

Q: I'm planning on enrolling two sons, can I use the \$100 discount for each?

A: If you plan on enrolling two students, then you can use the webinar discount in two separate orders for them. The other \$50 off is already factored into the price. The first step is to apply: www.collegeplus.org/prep/apply

Q: Why are Algebra and Geometry not listed as subjects to CLEP out of? College Freshman usually do have to take College Algebra

A: There is a college algebra CLEP exam. Geometry is worked into the college math CLEP.

Q: Are there Foreign Language requirements w/the Thomas Edison University BA or BS degrees?

A: TESC does not require Foreign Language credits for most of their degrees, however if you are strong in a foreign language, you can utilize either CLEP foreign language exams or NYU language proficiency exams to gain foreign language credit.

Q: Is Apologia also a curriculum that is recommended for CLEP?

A: Yes, Apologia is highly recommended. Many CollegePlus! students have used them to pass the CLEP science exams.

Q: Is the Understanding the Times curriculum good for the Worldview education you are talking about? Or is this something you get from CollegePlus?

A: We typically use the thinking Like A Christian program, though the Understanding The Times appears to be a good program.

Q: Will there be a replay of this available as last week?

A: Normally there would be but there was a technical glitch so there won't be a recording of this webinar. However there will be a Q and A transcript at www.collegeplus.org/webinars.

Q: Is the Charter Oak College in CT still recommended as an alternative to Thomas Edison?

A: COSC is a possible alternative. However, we have found through working with the different options, that TESC is the best overall choice for those going through the CollegePlus! program.

Q: Do we infer from these lists of subjects that these subjects are to be reserved until the last two years of high school since the junior year is the recommended start year for this program?

A: This list of subjects is addressing all years of high school, not just the last two.

Q: How can the program wait until the Junior year if the asterisked subjects are to be covered in all years?

A: This is because younger students have trouble combining their entire high school studies with college level accelerated coursework. However, by the time they engage in junior level work, they often are mentally prepared to handle both.

Q: What year is the prep program taken?

A: The CollegePlus! Prep is geared towards students between age 13-16.

Q: Will Thomas Edison State College allow any high school aged student to enroll through CollegePlus?

A: We've never had a high school student rejected by Thomas Edison. In fact, none of our students have ever been rejected.

Q: Will Thomas Edison College allow any high school aged student to enroll through CollegePlus!?

A: While Thomas Edison does not guarantee that a high school aged student from CollegePlus! will be able to enroll, they have never rejected any of our students who have applied. The primary requirement of Thomas Edison is that a student be a self-directed adult 21 years of age or older; if the student doesn't meet the age requirement Thomas Edison allows for an appeal of this rule. Every last student of ours to date has successfully appealed this rule, enrolled, and in most cases distinguished themselves as a top student.

Q: Does Classical Conversations adequately prepare students to understand Worldview, Logic and critical thinking well enough to help in taking the CLEP exams?

A: We typically use the Fallacy Detective, the Thinking Toolbox, Logic in 100 Minutes for logic; Thinking Like A Christian for worldview; and Building Thinking Skills for critical thinking. You may want to compare these with what you cover in Classical Conversations.

Q: What online colleges does CollegePlus generally recommend?

A: CollegePlus! students generally work with Thomas Edison State College, a fully accredited college in New Jersey. TESC has proved itself to be a leader in distance learning college

Q: Is there a payment plan for CP Prep?

A: No. Prep payment is made up front.

Q: Will you be sending a recording of this webinar through in email like you did with the last webinar?

A: We actually had a technical glitch and the recording won't be available. My apologies for that!

Q: are alpha and omega life packs good to prepare for history CLEPs?

A: If possible, can you please send me an e-mail at prep@collegeplus.org? I don't have the answer to this right now but will look forward to getting it to you promptly tomorrow.

Q: I understand that scholarship money may not apply toward the college prep program, however could any scholarship money be applied to the cost of gaining a degree through Thomas Edison College?

A: Absolutely! This is possible because Thomas Edison is a degree granting institution. recognized by the US ED.

Q: Do you have any recommendations for how a 12th grade student can utilize the core program without going through the prep program?

A: Most 12th graders will have already achieved a good foundation in many areas covered in Prep, so 12th graders should apply directly to CollegePlus! Core.

Q: if a student has already earned college scholarship, can it be applied to the cost of CollegePlus!?

A: No, this isn't possible at this time since CollegePlus! is not a degree granting institution.

Q: how much time would you say it typically takes to go through the prep skills program?

A: The CollegePlus! Prep is a 2 semester program that requires an average of 1 hour per day of student study.

Q: Does CollegePlus! provide a list of colleges that are CLEP friendly? Or must we research each college for their policies?

Q: is there a payment plan available for the CollegePlus! program?

Q: Would you say the math CLEP has the same basic math questions as say the SAT or ACT?

A: They are similar but the SAT and ACT are more comprehensive whereas the CLEPs are more specialized per exam.
